



Welcome to the 5th Annual Flag Painting Contest,

The Day on the Bay Festival continues the Flag Contest from previous Pirate Festivals. The cost is \$4 for student entries and \$10 for Adult or Corporate entries. Flags are available at the City by the Sea Museum, 401 Commerce Street or the Old Main Bookstore, 438 Main Street, Palacios. Please return to either place no later than **April 25 by 2:00 pm.**

The paintings can be any theme that is representative of Palacios area and the history of Matagorda County. Cattle, Fishing, Birds, Boating, Spanish, Mexican or French Explorers, Pirates or Karankawa natives and vacationing are examples of themes. The front of the flag should have the grommets to the left. You can initial and date the flag in a corner, but please **do not put your name on it.**

The Flags will be judged for originality, color and theme and each category will receive a 1st place prize of \$75, 2nd place prize of \$50 and 3rd place prize of \$25. They will be flown at the Day on the Bay Festival, May 2nd at the Palacios Coastal Pavilion, and the awards will be announced between 2 and 3:00. You do not have to be present to receive your award. If you are present, we ask you to be available to pick up your flag and join a parade flying them around the festival. You will receive your flag back to keep.

If possible, please mount your flag to a flag pole. We have made some by drilling holes in a pvc pipe and attaching with shower rings. If you don't have a pole, it will not affect your entry.
